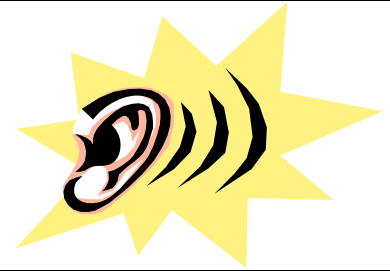

Annual Hearing Tests and Hearing Aid Checks

An annual hearing test is recommended for those 45 years & older, especially for anyone who experiences symptoms of hearing loss.

Some of the most common symptoms of hearing loss may include: difficulty understanding others without looking at the subject's face, often asking others to repeat themselves, difficulty in group situations, or complaints from others about the chosen volume of the television or radio.

Annual hearing tests allow the audiologist to monitor and note any possible changes in your hearing. Annual hearing aid checks will allow the audiologist to adjust your hearing aids to any changes in your hearing so that you can receive optimal benefit from wearing your hearing aids.

Hearing Aid Batteries

When not wearing your hearing aid, it is very important that you be sure to open the battery door. This will keep the battery from draining while the hearing aid is not in use, and will prolong the life of the battery. Keep the tab on the battery until you are ready to use it because the battery is activated by air exposure. Batteries should be stored at room temperature. The life of the batteries will be shortened by heat, and you should not store batteries in the refrigerator.

Carry extra batteries in your hearing aid case to be sure your battery will not die at an important time. Keep extra batteries in the original packaging or a battery holder to prevent the batteries from coming into contact with metal objects, which may cause them to leak or even rupture.

We are **NOT** able to mail batteries because they can explode during the delivery process.

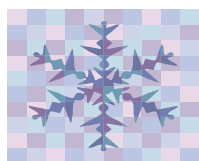
